# **WELCOME!**

## Kids' College 2025 at Midland College

KIDS' COLLEGE is a summer enrichment program for students ages 6 – 12 years old. The curriculum has been developed to offer courses that are fun and educational, in a college-like setting. We invite you to look over our schedule and make Kids' College a part of your summer plan!

To be eligible for Kids' College, students must be 6 -12 years old by June 2, 2025.

Extra time is built into the classes to allow for breaks and a snack time.



### **FEES**

Classes will range from \$50 to \$160 per class.

Two classes will be offered each week and most classes will meet for one class time slot, 1:00 p.m., and then the child will switch classes and go to their second time slot, 3:00 p.m. We will have a few classes (Computer classes, Summer STEM Discovery, Makers' Space, etc.) which meet during both class time slots, 1:00 and 3:00 p.m. Please note: all sports classes will be held indoors this year. We will not have any outdoor classes due to the extreme heat in June.

Students MUST be signed up for the full time from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM (either two classes or one of the longer classes that meet during both time slots).



### **Registration Process**

Online registration will open to the public in **early April**.

- 1. Online registration will be available on the Kids' College website, www.midland.edu/kidscollege
  - a. Complete the steps to create an account
  - b. Register each student attending
  - c. Register student in a class for BOTH class time slots (either two separate classes or one of the longer classes that meets during both time slots).
  - d. Student MUST be registered for the full afternoon, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.; there are no late drop offs or early pick-ups.
- 2. Once the registration form is submitted, a confirmation email with a link for payment will be sent. Payment is due in full at the time of registration. Lack of payment will result in child being dropped from Kids' College.

### **Student Schedules and Name Tags**

Student schedules and name tags will be available for pick up from the Kids' College Temporary Office at Midland College beginning Monday, May 26th. Office location is F. Marie Hall Academic Building (MHAB), Room 131.

Schedules and Name Tags may also be picked up on Saturday, May 31st from 9am to 12noon at the tent outside of the Allison Fine Arts building. More information on this event will be sent out in May.

If you are unable to pick up your student's name tag and schedule early, we will have a check-in table at the student drop off on the first day of each session. We encourage you to come early the day of to pick up your name tag in order to ensure enough time for your child to get to their class.

### **Scholarships**

Limited scholarships will be available and based on the needs of the student. A scholarship application MUST be completed and submitted to the Kids' College office by May 1, 2025. A link to the scholarship application is on the website, <u>www.midland.edu/kidscollege</u> .

Scholarships will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis and will not be awarded for more than 50% of the total registration cost. If a scholarship is awarded, the contact person will be notified via email within 7 – 10 business days after application is received with further instructions. Applications do not quarantee scholarship award.

#### Refunds

Class fees will be refunded ONLY if a student withdraws by noon on the Tuesday before the first day of the session, NO EXCEPTIONS. A processing fee will be assessed for the refund. All refund requests must be submitted in writing to the following email: cecommunityprograms@midland. edu. Refunds take up to 30 days to process.





### **Attendance**

Students are expected to attend each class for which they are enrolled. They are to remain in their class except during supervised breaks. A child should not attend a class that they are not enrolled in. Please communicate with your child about which classes they are enrolled in.

### Name Tags

Students are expected to wear their nametags for the duration of their time at Kids' College. If your child loses their name tag, please contact the Kids' College office via email for a replacement (cecommunityprograms@midland.edu).

### Conduct

The purpose of Kids' College is to provide an enrichment program in a fun, learning environment, therefore proper standards of conduct are necessary to protect the health, safety and well-being of all students. Kids' College students are expected to adhere to our Code of Conduct:

- Behavior that might interfere with the educational process is unacceptable.
- Students will be respectful of other students and staff.
- Students will be careful with college equipment, property and the property of other students.
- Safety of students is our first responsibility. Students MAY NOT GO ANYWHERE on campus without being accompanied by a Kids' College staff member.
- · Parents will be contacted if their child is involved in any unacceptable situations during the day. If you have been contacted due to unacceptable behavior, you will be asked to pick up your child.
- · Staff members have the right, at any time, to exclude any child from activities due to failure or inability to follow the code of conduct and any rules and/or policies for participants.

### Students may be removed from Kids' College if any of the following occur:

- · Bullying in any form
- Stealing another person's property
- Threats of bodily harm
- Engaging in any form of physical contact with others

### Breaks/Food/Water

There will be a break between the first and second class time slots to allow for classroom changes and a refreshment break.

Students should bring a refillable water bottle with them each day. Water to refill water bottles will be available during Kids' College. Bottled water will not be provided. A snack will be provided each day; please do not send food with your child.

### Drop-off/Pick-up

Drop-off/Pick-up will be in the parking lot of the Allison Fine Arts Building near the F. Marie Hall Academic Building. Tents and signs will mark the drop-off/pick-up area.

We will divide students into two groups: **Carpool Lane** group and **Walk-up** group. For Carpool Lane drop-off and pick-up, parents or quardians will remain in their vehicles and Kids' College Staff will transport your child to and from your vehicle. For Walk-up drop-off and pick-up, parents or quardians will park and walk their child to a Kids' College staff member. More information regarding drop-off and pick-up procedures will be sent in May.

### Please note the following:

- · Drop-off will begin at 12:45 p.m., promptly. Staff will not be available before this time
- · Please enter the Alison Fine Arts (AFA) parking lot and follow the directional signs. Cars will gueue up through the AFA parking lot to avoid a backup in the main traffic lanes.
- · Students who already have their name tag and schedule may be dropped off and will be directed to line up with their first class
- Students **NEEDING** their name tag and schedule **MUST** come to the check-in table when arriving.
- · Pick-up will begin at 5:00 p.m. Students will be brought to the curbside of their vehicle, so please remain in your car while in the pick-up line. Display the name sign provided to expedite the pick-up process.
- · Please refrain from honking or calling to your child during pick-up. All students must be released to their parent or guardian by a Kids' College Staff member in order to ensure safety.

Carpool ends at 5:20 p.m. Any student left after 5:20 p.m. will be taken to F. Marie Hall Academic Building, Room 131, (432) 685-4518.

Your child's safety is the first priority during Kids' College; therefore, campus police officers will assist Kids' College staff with traffic. Your patience and cooperation is appreciated.

Traffic assistants are strictly guided by the Midland College Police Department – please follow all instructions and do not deviate.


