Midland College Residency Requirements

Non-Residents or Out of State Residents Applying for In State or In District Residency

Determining Residency

- The student's current home address is used to determine residency.
- A post office box or dormitory address cannot be used to determine residency.
- To establish residency in the state of Texas, you must submit three qualifying documents from Section A.
- To claim residency as a dependent (based on a parent/legal guardian/spouse residency status), you must submit on document from Section B, in addition to the 3 qualifying documents from Section A
- If you are not a U.S. Citizen but Lawfully Present/Visa Holder, submit one document from Section C, in addition the 3 documents from Section A and Section B (if applicable).

A. Qualifying Documents

Submit 3 of the following documents. All three documents must be in the student's name or the student's parent/legal guardian's name and have a Texas address. All three documents must be dated 12 months prior to the census date of the semester in which the student is enrolled. Census dates can be found in the Midland College Academic Calendar at Midland.edu

- Texas Driver License
- Lease or deed
- Utility bill
- Texas Voter registration card
- Employer-provided employment verification or wage and earning statements
- Texas High School Transcript (must include senior year)
- Written Statements from one or more social service agencies

B. Dependent Qualifying Documents

If you are claiming residency as a dependent (based on a parent/legal guardian/spouse residency status) submit one of the following documents, in addition to the 3 documents from Section A. Document must be in the student's name or the student's parent/legal guardian's name

- Birth certificate or legal documents stating legal guardianship
- Tax form
- Marriage license

C. Non-US Citizens who are Lawfully Present/Visa Holder

If you are a Non-US Citizen who is lawfully present or Visa Holder Eligible to Domicile, submit one document from the list below in addition to the 3 documents from Section A and Section B (if applicable).
